




### **BACKGROUND**



# THE DRAFT PLAN (THE EIR "PROJECT")

- Time horizon year 2040 (20+ years)
- Vision, policies and programs
- Proposed capital improvements
  - (e.g. changes in roadway design, public facilities, public space)
- Zoning standards and guidelines
  - (e.g. building height, density and use)
- Projected estimate of potential development that could happen on vacant/underutilized land by 2040



### PREPARING THE EIR: WHAT IS A "PROGRAM" EIR

# A "program EIR" is a type of EIR that:

- Addresses large scale, long-term projects
- Analyzes the environmental impacts of the proposed project (the Plan) that have a physical effect on the environment.
- Streamlines future environmental review procedures of individual projects that are consistent with the Specific Plan\*

<sup>\*</sup>There are <u>no</u> specific development projects that are being proposed as part of the Plan)

\*Note: The following environmental topics will not be the subject of the Draft EIR: Aesthetics (for transit priority/infill sites), Agriculture and Forestry Resources and Mineral Resources (because no such resources are in the Plan Area).

#### **SUMMARY OF EIR ANALYSIS**

### The EIR will:

- Analyze environmental impacts of the Project (the Plan)
- Identify "mitigation measures" to avoid or minimize impacts that would be potentially significant
- Analyze alternatives to the Project that may be environmentally superior to the proposed Project, while also achieving project objectives

# **Vision**

The Adeline corridor is envisioned to be a "connector" that weaves together healthy, diverse and vibrant neighborhoods.

It will be a citywide and national model for equitable development, preserving and creating high-quality affordable housing for a range of income levels while providing economic opportunity through independent businesses, community non-profits, arts organizations, community markets, and a dynamic array of merchants and local services.

It will provide safe, complete streets and other public spaces that are walkable, bikeable, green, and accessible for persons of all ages and abilities.

It will be a place where history—the experiences and contributions of people, places and institutions that have made South Berkeley what it is today—is recognized and reflected in its future.

It will be a place where people in all stations of life have equitable access to shared prosperity, high quality of life, and a sense belonging as the neighborhood evolves into the future.

### **Plan Vision (Summary)**

- Make the Adeline Corridor a "connector" that weaves together healthy, diverse, and vibrant neighborhoods;
- Champion equitable, transit-oriented development, including highquality affordable housing for a range of income levels, and that supports a thriving business community populated by independent locally-owned business, non-profits and arts organizations;
- Provide safe, "complete streets" and other public spaces that are walkable, bikeable, green, and accessible for persons of all ages and abilities;
- Create a place where history—the experiences and contributions of people, places and institutions that have made South Berkeley what it is today—is recognized and reflected in its future; and,
- Create a place where people have equitable access and opportunity to shared prosperity and quality of life.
