Reallocating FY20 CDBG funds previously set aside for public facility improvements to housing improvements

CDBG FY21 **\$535,633**

 Reallocating FY21 CDBG funds previously set aside for a housing improvement (originally facility improvement funds and reallocated during Amendment #1)

Funding Priorities Framework

- ✓ CARES Act must focus on addressing COVID-19. Proposal addresses COB
 COVID-19 response gaps for vulnerable populations
 - Focused Equity Testing/Vaccine prioritizes homeless and other vulnerable populations
 - COVID-19 Housing Retention Mitigate housing loss and potential homelessness

Proposal addresses COB affordable housing priorities
 Housing Rehabilitation – Maintain affordable housing

Focused Equity Testing/Vaccine Strategy \$200,000 \$200,000 of CDBG-CV1

- Testing/vaccine and follow up support:
 - seniors
 - People of color with highest COVID prevalence
 - unhoused
 - shelter workers
- Estimate need of 3,000 tests or vaccines for 3,000 individuals at highest risk of severe complications from COVID-19 infection

COVID-19 Housing Retention Program (HRP) \$1,801,541

- \$1,088,644 of CDBG-CV1 previously allocated testing
- \$712,897 of new CDBG-CV3
- For the City's COVID-19 Housing Retention Program
- Minimum of 250-300 low-income households

Housing Rehabilitation \$1,963,233 \$535,633 of PY20 (FY21) CDBG previously allocated to hotel acquisition/rehab

\$1,427,600 of PY19 (FY20) of CDBG previously allocated to facility improvements

For Housing Rehabilitation

Rosewood Manor and Lorin Station Apartments

49 units

Recommendation

- 1. Accept additional CDBG-CV CARES Act Funding
- Allow City Manager to execute HUD agreements and amendments including:
 CARES Act funding
 - ≻ Revised PY20 (FY21) HUD entitlement allocations for CDBG & HOME
 - >Reaffirming Council 9/15/20 approved PY20 (FY21) HOME Funds as follows:
 - Up to 10% for Community Housing Development Organizations
 - Up to 25% for Administration
 - Remainder to the Housing Trust Fund
- 3. Allow the City Manager Submit the revised Consolidated and Annual Action Plans (PY19 & PY20) to HUD
- 4. Allow City Manager to execute related expenditure contracts
