#### **BACKGROUND**

#### **Hate Crime:**

 A criminal act committed in whole or in part because of the victim's real or perceived protected social group


#### **Hate Incident:**

- An action or behavior motivated by hate but does not reach the level of a crime.
- Includes insults, name calling, displaying hate material on your own property

Reported Hate Crimes Since 2016 as of 10/31/2022


#### Reported Hate Crimes by Year

Reported Hate Crimes Since 2016 as of 10/31/2022


More recent incidents are marked by darker points.


