Impact

 75% Reduction in unsheltered homelessness in 3 years

Outcomes

- 1. Our residents are sheltered
 - Percentage of people connected to shelter
 - Percentage of people matched to housing resources
- 2. Dangerous encampments are not inevitable

 - Number of encampment closures
- 3.Our City is clean
 - Pounds of trash and debris removed
 - Number of storage notices given

Deep dive on People's Park Encampment:


- 86% (55 of 64) of original census encampment residents were sheltered or housed:
 - 66% (42 of 64) of clients were sheltered:
 - 63% (40 of 64) clients were sheltered through the Roadway Inn
 - 2% (1 of 64) clients were sheltered through Horizons
 - 2% (1 of 64) clients were sheltered through transitional housing
 - 20% (13 of 64) of clients were permanently housed:
 - 8% (5 of 64) of clients moved to subsidized housing
 - 13% (8 of 64) of clients found other housing opportunities

Deep dive on People's Park Encampment:


- 14% (9 of 64) of original census encampment residents remained unhoused:
 - 11% (7 of 64) of clients voluntarily relocated
 - 3% (2 of 64) of clients remained at park

Deep dive on People's Park Encampment:

- 73% (73 of 100) of encampment residents were sheltered or housed:
 - 60% (60 of 100) of clients were sheltered:
 - 45% (45 of 100) clients were sheltered through the Roadway Inn
 - 14% (14 of 100) clients were sheltered through Horizons
 - 1% (1 of 100) clients were sheltered through transitional housing
 - 13% (13 of 100) of clients were permanently housed:
 - 5% (5 of 100) of clients moved to subsidized housing
 - 8% (8 of 100) of clients found other housing opportunities



Number of shelter referrals provided to residents:




Outcome #2: Dangerous encampments are not inevitable

Number of notices given to tent encampments:


738 tents and structures were provided notices for the following reasons:



HRT Actions




HRT Actions by District
