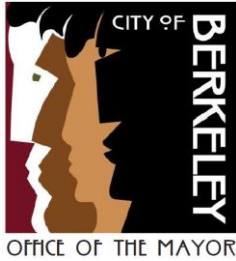
Emergency Situation (54954.2(b)(1) - majority vote required)

Relinquishment of Council Office Budget Fund to General Fund and Grant
of Such Funds

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution approving the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$500.00 per council member, including \$500.00 from Mayor Arreguín, to Berkeley City College with funds relinquished to the City's general fund for this purpose from the discretionary council office budget of Mayor Arreguín and any other council members who would like to contribute.

BACKGROUND

Berkeley City College, formerly Vista Community College, was founded in April 1974 as the fourth of the Peralta Community College District's community colleges, replacing the existing North Peralta Community College.

Its original name, the Berkeley Learning Pavilion, was changed in October 1974 to the Peralta College for NonTraditional Study (PCNS) and its mission expanded to that of, "...a public community college offering alternative post-secondary educational programs and services for students of the [Peralta Community College District]. The college [was] expected to assess unmet learning needs, to devise flexible and diverse ways of responding to those needs, and thereby to increase access to educational opportunities."

In 1978, the district voted to change the college's name to Vista College. Candidacy was renewed in 1979, and the college was granted full accreditation in June 1981. In June 2006, Vista Community College's name was changed to Berkeley City College and classes and programs moved into their new home at 2050 Center St. in fall 2006. AUTHORIZE THE EXPENDITURE OF SURPLUS FUNDS FROM THE OFFICE EXPENSE ACCOUNTS OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL MEMBERS FOR A GRANT TO PROVIDE PUBLIC SERVICES FOR A MUNICIPAL PUBLIC PURPOSE

WHEREAS, Berkeley City College, formerly Vista Community College , was founded in April 1974 as the fourth of the Peralta Community College District's community colleges, replacing the existing North Peralta Community College; and

WHEREAS, in 1978, the district voted to change the college's name to Vista College, the college was granted full accreditation in June 1981, and in June 2006, Vista Community College's name was changed to Berkeley City College and classes and programs moved into their new home at 2050 Center St. in fall 2006; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor's Office is thrilled to join Berkeley City College ("BCC") in celebrating 50 years in the City of Berkeley; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Arreguín has surplus funds in his office expenditure account; and

WHEREAS, a California non-profit tax-exempt corporation – the Peralta Foundation – will receive funds in the amount of \$500.00; and

WHEREAS, the provision of such services would fulfill the following municipal public purpose: Berkeley City College serves students who seek general education, transfer to four-year universities, degrees and certificates in liberal arts and occupational areas, career preparation or pre-collegiate skills, and the student body represents a diverse mix of ethnic, cultural and economic backgrounds – high school students enrolled in advanced courses, full time workers, people who wish to transfer to a four-year university and individuals who are the first in their families to attend college; and

WHEREAS, the college is an active partner in local economic development and employment training endeavors; and

WHEREAS, this grant will go toward Berkeley City College's 50th Anniversary Gala on May 2; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Berkeley that funds relinquished by the Mayor and council members from their council office budget of up to \$500.00 per office shall be granted to the Peralta Foundation.
