"Good of the City" Analysis:

The analysis below must demonstrate how accepting this supplement/revision is for the "good of the City" and outweighs the lack of time for citizen review or evaluation by the Council.

On December 14, 2020, the Budget & Finance Policy Committee (Policy Committee) met and voted to:

- 1. Send to staff the Mayor's proposal, allowing flexibility in Measure P and U1 allocations;
- 2. Request that the City Manager present a funding plan proposal at the December 15, 2020, City Council meeting;
- 3. Include the proposal by Councilmember Harrison to use the \$5M requested for Police overtime as follows: \$2.5M OT, \$1M OT in reserves to access as needed, and \$1.5M to the 115 Trust;
- 4. Include funding for preservation of communications

Vote: Ayes – Arreguin, Droste; Noes – None; Abstain – Harrison; Absent – None

Included in Attachment 3 is the City Manager's funding plan proposal. The changes to the Mayor's December 14, 2020, proposal are highlighted. In addition, we are recommending the following balancing measures.

Balancing Proposal:

Included in Mayor's Budget - \$5 million to Police overtime

Propose

\$3.5 million - Allocation to Police overtime

\$1 million – Set aside reserve allocated to Police overtime as needed. If the \$1 million is not needed the amount should be redirected to the 115 Pension Trust. Savings \$500,000

Included in Mayor's Budget – Fire Department Compressor Truck \$350,000 Propose

Defer funding the Compressor Truck until the FY 2022 Budget Adoption in June 2021. **Savings \$350,000**

Total Savings \$850,000

AMENDING THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE NO. 7,724–N.S. FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the City of Berkeley as follows:
