

The City of Berkeley Public Works Department will soon pave approximately 11 miles of streets throughout the City. The paving will greatly improve the conditions of City streets for many years to come, making it easier to walk, bicycle and drive in Berkeley. The work is being completed in three separate projects. This project includes the following streets:

Construction is expected to begin in June/July and take four months to complete. Standard work hours are 7:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Monday – Friday. The amount paved this year is approximately 3 times the annual amount paved in recent years. The increased amount of paving is made possible by Measure M, the \$30 million streets and watersheds bond passed by Berkeley voters in 2012. Collectively, the three paving projects are funded by Measure M, Measure B, Sales Tax, General Fund Capital, and Gas Tax. Measure M is also funding the installation of green infrastructure projects throughout the City, which will reduce the flow and increase the treatment of storm water before entering the City’s storm drain system, local creeks and the San Francisco Bay. These projects will also reduce the frequency and magnitude of localized flooding.

Though the benefits are long-term, there will be some short-term inconveniences during construction. Temporary traffic delays, parking restrictions, and street closures should be expected. Usual parking restrictions, including for street cleaning, will remain in effect. Driveway access may be restricted during work hours. Those sensitive to petroleum products should be aware that asphalt will be used in this project. Close your windows and doors. Park outside the construction area to avoid oil spray or other complications. Oil and asphalt is not easily removed from feet, shoes, floors, and rugs. If you are a business owner, please contact the City or the Contractor to coordinate delivery schedules for your business. City street trees will be trimmed by the City’s Forestry Division. Property owners are responsible for trimming their trees and vegetation growing into the roadway.
