



## PUBLIC NOTICE

### Drainage Improvement Project

The City of Berkeley, Public Works Department, will be improving drainage in your neighborhood.

**LOCATIONS:** Street drainage work will be done at five intersections, Hearst at Sixth, Curtis at Francisco, Jones at Tenth, Stuart at California, Bancroft at Bolivar, and at a sixth location along a portion of the 1000 block of Cragmont Avenue.

**PROJECT SCOPE:** Drain pipes and inlets at each location were installed more than 50 years ago and have significantly deteriorated. The City will replace the deteriorated pipes and inlets, and repave the intersections to improve drainage.

**TIMELINE:** Construction is expected to begin mid-September 2016 and project completion is expected to take approximately seven months. Construction operations for any one of the five intersections or the 1000 block of Cragmont Avenue, is not expected to last longer than 8 weeks to complete. The contractor's approved work hours are 7:30 a.m. – 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. **POSSIBLE INCONVENIENCES:** Traffic may be impacted at the work site and temporary street closures may be necessary but street closures are not expected to exceed 12 hours at a time. "No Parking" signs will be posted along the work areas 3 days in advance and will be enforced by the Police Department. Please review the posted no parking signs for exact hours and locations as they may vary according to scheduled tasks. All other usual parking restrictions, including no parking for street cleaning, will still be in effect. Access to private driveways may be impeded during some operations. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained at all times.

#### PROPERTY OWNER AND RESIDENT ACTIONS:

- Sensitive to Petroleum: Be aware that asphalt will be used in this project
- Safety: Keep children and pets away from work area
