CITY OF BERKELEY HEALTH ALERT UPDATE COVID-19 TESTING CHANGES 03/09/2020

Situation

On March 4, 2020 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) <u>expanded criteria for</u> <u>COVID-19 testing</u>, and providers may now use clinical judgment to identify suspect cases. Large commercial laboratories and other non-public health referral laboratories are offering COVD-19 testing. Providers should send specimens to these laboratories. According to the California Department of Public Health, a CDC PUI number of COVID-19 ID numbers is also not required for testing at these facilities.

Providers assessing City of Berkeley residents should order COVID-19 testing through commercial laboratories and other non-public health laboratories offering COVID-19 testing. Providers may determine which patients are suspect COVID-19 cases using clinical judgment. City of Berkeley Communicable Disease Prevention and Control Program (COB-CDPCP) approval is **NOT REQUIRED** for testing done at commercial laboratories.

Please alert COB-CDPCP for testing of patients with the highest risk of exposure including **close contacts** (household or health care worker) with a lab confirmed case or history of travel to an area with <u>CDC Level 3 travel warning</u>. Providers assessing Berkeley residents should use the <u>Testing Guidance</u> to request COVID-19 testing by the Alameda County Public Health Lab (ACPHL). ACPHL performs testing on weekdays only.

ACTIONS REQUESTED OF PROVIDERS:

- 1. Direct COVID-19 testing to commercial laboratories and other non-public health laboratories now offering COVID-19 testing, when possible.
- 2. Request COVID-19 testing by ACPHL using procedure linked above.
- 3. Report priority suspect COVID-19 cases to COB-CDPCP:
 - Persons with suspected COVID-19 and exposure to a known case
 - Persons with suspected COVID-19 and recent travel to an <u>area with CDC Level 3</u> travel warning
 - Healthcare workers with suspected COVID-19 and exposure to a known or suspected case
- Report all newly diagnosed COVID-19 cases by telephone within one hour. COVID-19 is a novel virus infection with pandemic potential, thus confirmed cases are reportable by providers and laboratories as required per Title 17 California Code of Regulations Section 2500.
- 5. Ensure specimens from your facility go to appropriate laboratory.
